Humanitarian Interlude While on Safari in Kenya or Tanzania

Take a 2 day break during your Kenya or Tanzania safari and experience Kenyan life first hand. For a \$1,000* per person tax-deductible donation you will: visit Pulung's Primary School where you will have a class activity with students and meet parents; eat a traditional Kenyan lunch at Narok Girls' Safe House; and distribute mosquito nets in a traditional Maasai village.



Pulung's Primary has no electricity or running water and is located in a very arid area. Enrollment is 300 students, nursery thru class 8. Class 1 enrollment is 55 students, 50% boys and girls. By the time the students reach Class 8, enrollment drops to 10 students with 2 girls.

OFDC funded the building of 8 pit latrines to improve sanitation at Pulung's Primary. OFDC's repair of the water catchment tank gives clean water to the students. Desks are next on the list.



Join us at Pulung's Primary, going into the classroom and working with students on a pre-planned activity of your choice. Afterwards, you'll sit under the shade of a tree as students perform traditional song and dance. You'll hear from the community council, the parents' council and the

headmaster. Next, we lunch at Narok Girls' Safe House where you are free to ask questions about FGM (female genital mutilation or circumcision) and forced early marriage.

On your final day, travel to a traditional Maasai village and distribute mosquito nets. Every 30 seconds a child in Africa dies from malaria. Feel free to enter a *manyatta* (huts made of mud and cow dung), take photos of village life and greet the mamas and children.



Itinerary:

DAY 1: Arrive in Narok Town around noon where you will be greeted by and lunch with Patrick and Josephine Ngigi, your hosts for the next 2 days. After lunch, Patrick and Josephine will escort you around Narok Town where you can use the internet at a cyber café, buy curios from shoppes or just watch the colorful life of the town. Dinner is on your own. Overnight at the Chambai Hotel with private bath and TV.



DAY 2: Breakfast at hotel with Patrick and Josephine and travel to Pulung's Primary. At the school, you'll spend 1 hour leading your classroom activity, watch children perform, and talk with parents. Observe farming in the area and the school setting. Lunch at the Narok Girls' Safe House. Dinner is on your own. Overnight at the Chambai Hotel.

DAY 3: Breakfast at the hotel. Pick up Josephine and travel to Maasai village to distribute nets and experience village life. Return to safari late morning.

*Minimum of 2 people, maximum of 7. Participation in 8 hour pre-trip orientation including culture and lesson planning is required. Two nights and breakfast at Chambai Hotel are included in your donation as is lunch at the Narok Girls' Safe House. Day 1 and 2 dinners are on your own to accommodate individual dining desires. OFDC will commission and pay for your safari van and driver during your Humanitarian Interlude.
