### REASON TO DONATE

\$1 a person for clean water—1 well costs \$600 and gives clean water to 600 students and villagers.

Villagers share 20% of the cost and provide the unskilled labor.

Sand, cement, bricks and hardware are purchased. A skilled laborer is paid to hand-dig the 85' deep well.

The rope and bucket are the only parts that can break. Both are easily replaced by the school and villagers.
